12. Is enough to support marriages and families in need?		
13. Is enough being done to support those in need? (Poor; sick; migrants; bereaved etc.)

15. Is enough being done to encourage youth and young adults to develop a friendship with Jesus?		
16. Does a sense of community exist in the parish where people feel known, loved and supported?
